Safari Zones:

Dhikala Zone (core zone): Most popular and scenic; great for tiger sightings and birdwatching. **Bijrani** Zone: Known for its dense forest and diverse flora-fauna.

Jhirna Zone: Open year-round; famous for wildlife spotting.

Dhela Zone: Rich in birdlife and less crowded.

Durga Devi Zone: Hilly terrain, ideal for birding and nature photography.

Corbett: November to June (for best tiger sightings; Dhikala zone is open only from 15 Nov to 15 June).

Book Corbett safaris and forest lodges well in advance.

Carry woollens for Nainital even in summer; nights can be cool.

Respect wildlife rules; do not litter or make noise in forest areas

Combine with Ranikhet, Almora, or Mukteshwar for an extended Kumaon trip.
